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THE NEW CHILDREN'S MUSEUM RECEIVES IRVINE FOUNDATION GRANT TO EXPLORE NEW ENGAGEMENT OPPORTUNITIES

Project to Culminate in Free Mass Creativity Day, June 22

Tuesday, February 5, 2013 - San Diego - The Board of Directors of The James Irvine Foundation has approved a \$175,000 grant to The New Children's Museum for a newly created Mass Creativity Event series. This project includes art-making workshops in low-income, ethnically diverse San Diego communities culminating in a large annual celebration at the Museum. NCM will partner with eight community-based organizations for its outreach workshops. The first annual Mass Creativity Day, a free daylong outdoor celebration, will be held June 22 at the Museum.

“The New Children's Museum is dedicated to providing inventive and engaging art experiences that are meaningful to children and families,” explained Tomoko Kuta, Director of Education and Exhibitions. “This grant enables us to go beyond the walls of the Museum and make these experiences available to a wider audience.”

Overall, The James Irvine Foundation has approved 53 grants totaling just over \$14.5 million in support of the Foundation's mission of expanding opportunity for the people of California to participate in a vibrant, successful and inclusive society.
